- 2 The late substitute that bagged two against Lille to finish the game a draw at 2-2. (4,11)
- 5 A Uruguayan that went on to have a spell at Liverpool. (6,5)
- 6 He scored three goals for Shelbourne in European competition. He netted against SK Brann, Kilmarnock and then Glasgow Rangers in the 1998-99 UEFA Cup. (4,10)
- 7 A clinical finisher like his cousin Robbie Keane. (5,5)
- 9 Shelbourne's all time leading goalscorer. (4,5)

- 3 This former Shelbourne player made 535 appearances for Man United, an unsung hero of Sir Matt Busby's trailblazing side of the 1960s. (4,5)
- 4 Scored the famous winning goal in the 1996 FAI Cup Final replay at Dalymount Park to deny St Patrick's Athletic the league and cup 'double'. (7,9)
- 8 In 1999, he played for Panionios under Ronnie Whelan. He was part of the team that reached the quarter-final of the UEFA Cup Winners' Cup. He made a move back to Shells the year after. (5,7)
- 9 Former Ireland manager turned Shelbourne FC manager. (4,5)
- 10 He befuddled opponents with extravagant moves, this Cameroonian always seemed to play with a smile on his face. (6,3)
